



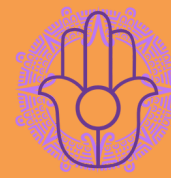

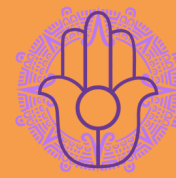

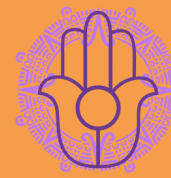

Professor Claudio Lomnitz, Columbia University
“On the Integration of Jewish History into Latin American History (And Vice Versa)— A Personal Perspective”

Claudio Lomnitz is Campbell Family Professor of Anthropology at Columbia University and is a member of Mexico’s El Colegio Nacional. He is a prolific scholar, journalist and playwright; his critically acclaimed *Nuestra América: My Family in the Vertigo of Translation* is a study in Jewish and Latin American family history, published by Other Press in 2021; it was listed by Kirkus Reviews in the top 10 non-fiction books for that year. Lomnitz serves on the board of numerous journals and academic institutions. Several of his books have won prizes; he was a Fellow at the Wissenschaftskolleg zu Berlin for 2011-12, and was awarded Germany’s Alexander von Humboldt Stiftung Prize in 2016.
